Today our Employment Program assists individuals who are LGBTQ+, impacted by HIV, and/or living with a disability. We offer job search assistance, career exploration, maintenance of employment, 1:1 and cohort programming.

Four times a year we offer a Community Health Apprenticeship Program. This program is designed for black and brown LGBTQ young people to become HIV testers and get jobs in community organizations.
