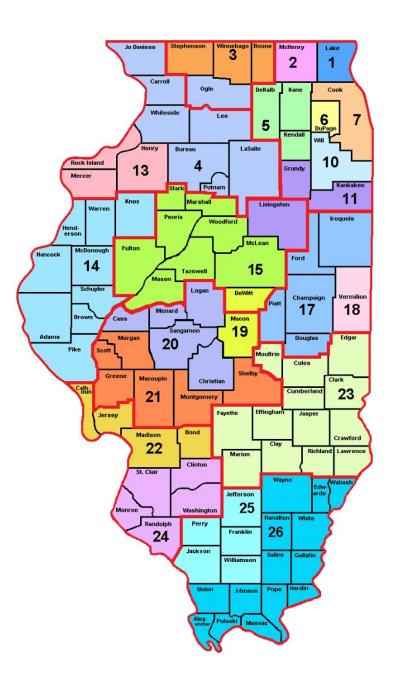


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



Illinois Career Pathways Dictionary Relaunch

A first-of-its-kind resource for policymakers and practitioners, providing Illinois' definition for a career pathway and terms essential to pathway programs and system elements.

- First released in 2018 as a PDF
- Now relaunched as a stand-alone website at <u>pathwaysdictionary.org</u>
 - Includes new and updated definitions
 - Provides implementation guidance and resources

Origins of the Career Pathways Dictionary and why relaunch 2.0










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




Why create a Dictionary?

- Practitioners in the field expressed a need for greater clarity around pathways policy and strategy after ~10 years of work in different sectors
- Work was underway to adopt a unified Career Pathways definition for Illinois
- Many terms being used across different federal and state funding streams without alignment
- Desire to foster greater collaboration across State agencies
- There was nothing like it around!


How was the Pathways Dictionary developed?



Survey

- Circulated to a range of stakeholders:
 Illinois Education and Career Success Network
 - College and Career Access Persistence and Success (CCAPS)
 Illinois Workforce Innovation Board (IWIB)
 Illinois Workforce Partnership (IWP)
- 211 responses received
- Themes that emerged
 - Questions about how the dictionary intersects with recent policy changes Clarification on Early College Credit

 - Distinction between Program of Study and Career Pathway
 - Desire for implémentation guidance
 - Interest in a more interactive dictionary and links to resources
 - May be helpful to offer simpler language to use with students and families



Career Pathway Dictionary 2.0

Process

- Conducted a survey to gain a deeper understanding of the dictionary's relevance and use in the field.
- Convened interagency group (DCEO, IDES, ISAC, ICCB, IBHE, and ISBE) to work through updates and updated design

Updates

- Added new terms
- Updated definitions to reflect current best practices
- Embedded resources throughout
- Included source citation for each definition
- Added category feature
- Added option to sign up to be notified of future updates
- Increased ability to share and edit





What we plan to do

- Share extensively throughout Illinois via:
 - agency websites
 - word-of-mouth
 - professional development opportunities and conferences
- Tie to funding (e.g. NOFOs, RFPs, etc.)
