
Employment Barriers Faced by ELLs and Strategies to Overcome Them

Employment Barriers



Primary Barriers Include:

- Limited English Language Ability (ELA): from Beginning Literacy onwards
- Limited Finances: low income quite common among new arrivals, refugees, and migrants
- ♦ Limited Time: disproportionate amount of time navigating everyday life
- ♦ Limited Experience: cultural differences that stand in the way of employment
- ♦ Limited Confidence: low expectations for themselves and their families

Overcoming Barriers: ESL

- ♦ Native Language Teachers for Beginning Levels, not for Intermediate and Advanced Levels
- Emphasis on Everyday & Practical Language Acquisition:
 Colloquialisms, Small Talk, Business English, etc.
- Technology Focus: Canvas, Burlington English, etc.
- ♦ In-Person and Online/Remote (Zoom) Options
- Nontraditional Class Schedules
- ♦ Direct Employment Content in Classes: resume building, interview prep, real and mock job searches, etc.
- ♦ ESL Today: Beyond 'Bread and Butter' Curriculum
