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Executive Role – By-Laws

There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of no more than nine members, including:

- (i) A Board Co-Chair
- (ii) A Majority of Business Members
- (iii) A representative of the Education System

The Executive Committee shall have the authority of the Board when it is not feasible for the entire Board to be convened.

Duties of the Committee shall include, but not be limited to...

- Conduct recruitment of businesses
- Provide Recommendations for amendments to the bylaws
- Provide Recommendations to the Governor and legislator for amendments to the IWIB State
 Board Act

- Discuss and make recommendations to the Board on innovative approaches to the training and education of its workforce customers and employers and the use of Registered Apprenticeships
- Review and participate in discussions on new policies related to the workforce in the State of Illinois

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- Invite Board members, including Committee Chairs, into discussions to provide expert knowledge
- Request Committee Chairs report on the committee's activities and results before presentations to the Board.

Encourage full member participation in meetings in an active manner and be responsible for ensuring a convening of the workforce development system's stakeholders, brokering relationships with a diverse range of employers, and leveraging support for workforce development activities.

Responsibilities

- review and be included in discussions on new policy related to workforce in the State of Illinois,
- Craft, guide, and approve the IWIB Quarterly meeting agendas
- establish committees that are deemed necessary to assist the IWIB in performing their duties (i.e. standing committees, task forces, and work groups),

Responsibilities

- discuss and make recommendations to the board on innovative approaches to the training and education of its workforce customers and employers, including the use of Registered Apprenticeships,
- recommend chairs for standing committees and task forces to the board and provide official invitations,
- recommend amendments to the bylaws,
