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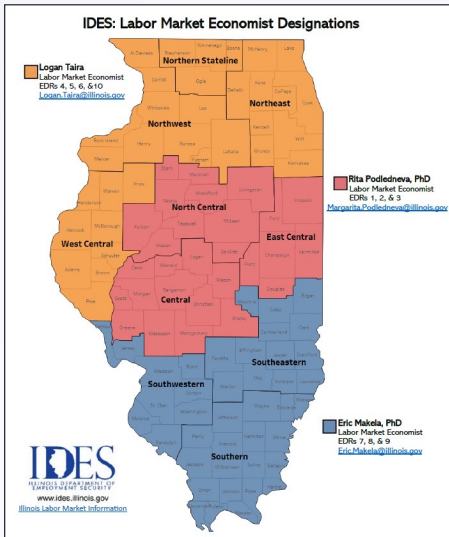

# Current Labor Market Information

**Knowing the current situation in your area may help you answer the following questions:**

- ▶ Is a layoff event part of regular labor market fluctuations or an overall labor market trend?
- ▶ Is a layoff event unique to an area, or is it part of a bigger picture?

**Two main sources of information:**

- ▶ **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)** ⇒ unemployment rates; labor force, employed/unemployed counts
- ▶ **Current Employment Statistics (CES)** ⇒ industry composition and jobs counts

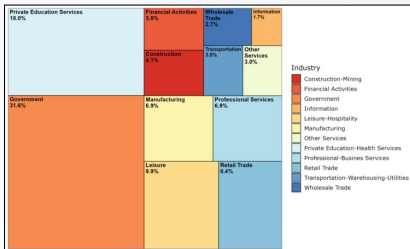
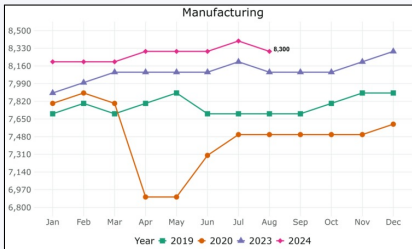

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## Help Wanted Online (HWOL)

The Conference Board-Lightcast Help Wanted OnLine® Data Series (HWOL) program monitors the number of seasonally and not seasonally adjusted online job ad openings posted by Illinois employers. This data is produced to assist individuals seeking job opportunities with information on jobs ads by employer and by occupation in their region.

To assist our job seeking customers during this rapidly changing environment, our team has only included new job postings during the prior 30 days for the EDR and Statewide HWOL reports. This information shows only the employers and occupations that have recently posted job ads so we can provide the most up to date information on available jobs.

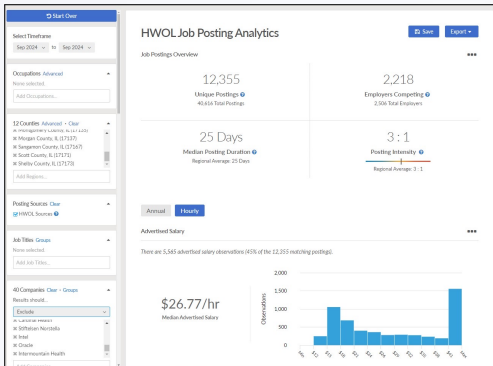

**In the near future IDES we will not be able to produce these reports:**

- ▶ BLS eliminated funding, support for the MLS program in 2013.
- ▶ IDES relies on outdated software without BLS support or support from DoIT.

**Our suggestion:** Develop a new report using the weekly claimant file and MS Office software.

- ▶ Not a 5-week moving window ⇒ based on initial claims from the previous week.
- ▶ Employer details (name, address, etc.) available.
- ▶ Access through the protected server.
