Sending handouts next.

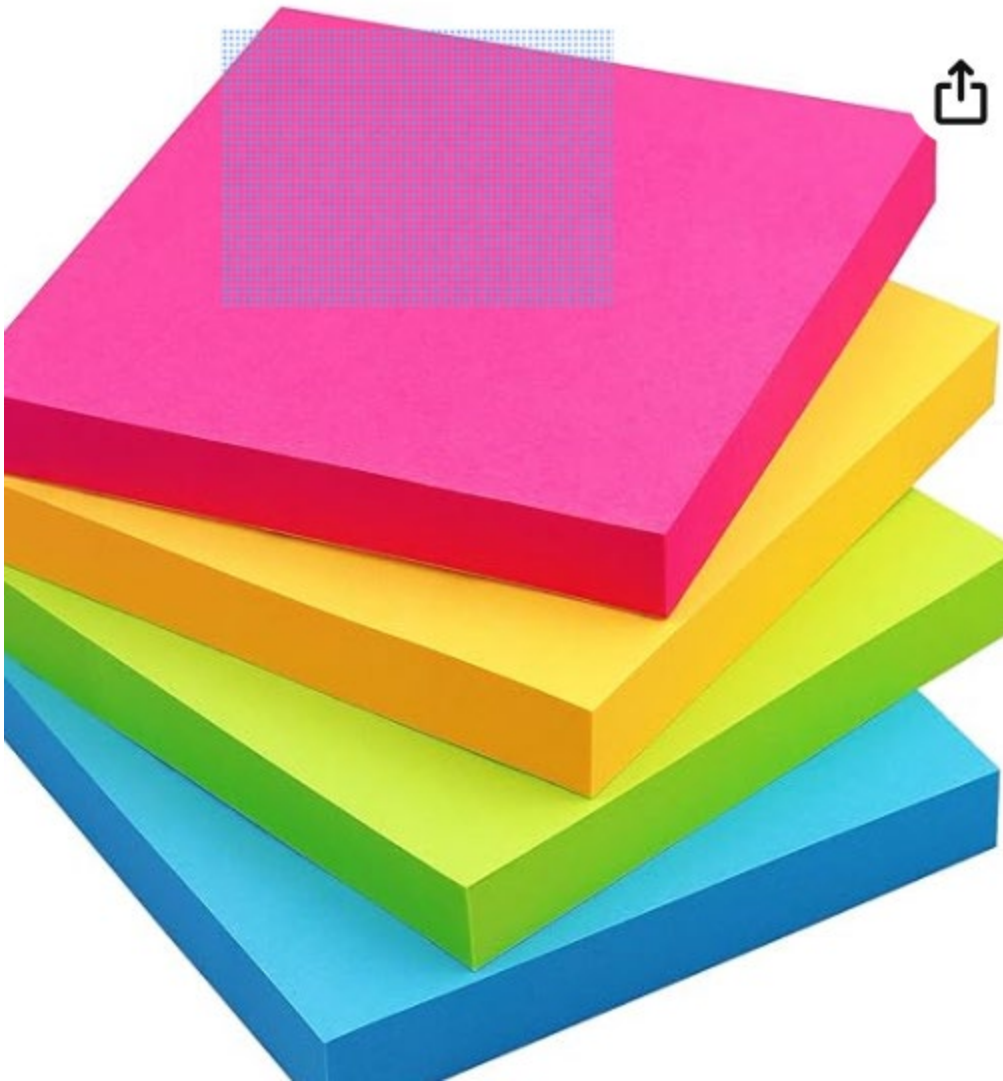

Aimee,

I know the supplies we need for the session. It is very participatory, with me doing some but little talking. The problem is that because I don't know the number of attendees, I can't guess how many of anything we will need. Generally speaking, I like to have five people per group. So, if we have 40 people, that is eight groups, if that helps.

What each group needs:

At least 3 different color pads of post-it-notes. 3 x 3 can work.



I use Scotch tape for each group because, in my experience, post-it notes don't stick well for very long. The scotch tape keeps their work secure.

(I don't think you need a picture of scotch tape :)

I need each group to have a sheet of these file dots. Each group needs three colors, and only one sheet per group.



Each group would need some markers, preferably the size of Sharpies. Those can be multi-colored or just black. That doesn't make a difference.



And last but not least: (I have bought these at Walmart before. You just have to be careful about size. Some are too small. 36 x 48 works. 30 x 36 works. Anything smaller is a struggle.
